

I. Objectives:

1. Students will learn to select the correct type of magazine paper.
2. Students will be able to match **the motif that will be printed** with **the magazine paper onto which it will be printed.**
3. Students will learn how to make a low relief for block print using a thin styrofoam sheet.
4. Students will learn how to make a block print.
5. Students will recognize that the printed motif is mirror-reverse to the cut-out motif.

II. Media

1. Styrofoam pieces from take-out trays.
2. Scissors, x-acto knife
3. Pencils and Pens
4. Non-Glossy magazine picture, size 8 1/2" x 11" -- text could be included.
(for example, picture -- possibly with text -- from the magazine *Ideals* OR a colored copy of any magazine picture)
5. Printing material for block print (Blockprint ink, Brayer, Tray)

III. Procedure

1. Select a magazine picture.
2. Design a motif as a part of the chosen picture, for example, a bird in a tree.
There can be more than one motif.
3. Transfer the motif onto a piece of thin styrofoam, using a pencil or a pen.
Press slightly to get a low relief ready for a block print.
Draw the outer and the inner lines, including the textures (for example, feathers of a bird).
4. Cut the motifs using scissors
5. In the case of enclosed parts to be cut out, use a x-acto knife.
6. Select a part of the picture that your motif should be on.
7. Print the motif onto the magazine picture.
